GDPR Compliance

We will implement the relevant tools and practices to ensure the safeguarding of any data handled by Plymouth (UK) HOG Chapter and all of its committee members and volunteers.

Committee members and volunteers will be made aware of GDPR restrictions, with the relevant training provided as necessary.
